VOLUNTEER- CLIENT ADVOCACY PROGRAM	Our Volunteer-Client Advocacy Program (V-CAP) was created in order to support clients in overcoming the systemic and language barriers many face when accessing services. V-CAP volunteers will be put "on-call" and will receive e-mailed and/or phone requests for accompanying clients to legal, medical, and other appointments. During these accompaniments, V-CAPs help liaise with public assistance officers, attorneys, and others by providing advocacy and/or interpretation. RESIDENTIAL CHILDREN'S PROGRAM	NYAWC's shelters house a number of survivors of violence as well as their children. At any given time, our shelters house approximately 10 children. We are seeking volunteers to plan group activities for children living in our shelters. Previous activities have included outdoor games, arts and crafts, and reading. Volunteers are welcome to discuss other activities with staff and are encouraged to share other skills and lead new activities. The program also hosts wellness and empowerment activities on weekends. In response to the need for culturally sensitive and language accessible services for Asian victims of trafficking in New York City, the New York Asian Women's Center has initiated Project Free. Project Free helps victims regain their freedom and recover from trauma through services such as counseling, case management, advocacy, and legal coordination. Project Free also conducts outreach to the Asian communities, law enforcement, and other service providers in New York City to heighten awareness about trafficking. All volunteers are encouraged to bring their passions and skills into our classrooms. Responsibilities include participating in planning creative, strength-based workshops for adolescent youth affected by domestic violence, and developing consistent and positive relationships with students and each other. DAT aims to provide a safe, supportive, non-judgmental environment for the discovery of friendship, talents, and opportunities for personal and academic growth.
